Music (Working with TVMS)	Children in Reception participate in weekly music sessions through Tees Valley Music Service. Children in Nursery are exposed to a range of instruments and are encouraged to listen to, copy and repeat sounds and sound patterns.					
Nursery Maths	Visual maths, number rhymes, stories and songs with puppets. Counting by rote, numeral recognition and touch counting. Using 2D shapes and colours to create pictures and patterns. Exposure to language involving capacity, length, size and volume.

Early Reading – Nursery	All children to take home a story book and action words (when they are developmentally ready). Reading in the reading corner encouraged in free play. Adults to read to children daily. Phonics teaching using phase 1 of Letters and Sounds and the songs and actions from Jolly Phonics teaching programme when introducing letter sounds. Exploring different types of books e.g. Non Fiction Learning the features of a book e.g. front cover and page number.					
Early Reading - Reception	Phonics teaching using the Jolly Phonics teaching programme. All children have tricky words to learn, a bedtime story book and reading book appropriate to their Phonic reading level. Daily story sessions.
