As hall time is limited, we do try to get outside as often as possible, unless the weather is particularly poor.

Homework – Y5

There is grid in the children's homework books from which they choose one task to complete per week. This grid is changed at the beginning of each half term.

Homework books should be handed in on a **Thursday** to be marked and returned to the children by **Friday**.

Weekly spellings will be given out on a **Tuesday** and tested the following **Monday**.

Reading Plus or a reading book to be read at least 4 times per week and recorded in Reading Records, signed by an adult.

Homework – Y6

Homework goes out on a **Wednesday** to be returned by the following **Monday**.

Rising Stars work books have been ordered.

Each child will receive a Punctuation and Grammar, a Reading Comprehension and a Maths booklet. We will tell them which pages to complete each week which they will record in their homework diary.

Weekly spellings will be given out on a **Monday** and a spelling test will be completed on a **Friday**.

Reading Plus or a reading book to be read at least 4 times per week and recorded in Reading Records, signed by an adult.

Mathematics

It is expected that all children should know their times tables up to 12×12 by Year Five.

These are essential for:

solving problems

working with fractions

calculating with decimals

converting between measurements e.g. cm to m or km

Every child has a log in for Times Table Rockstars, which gives them a fun platform to learn their tables.



Regular Reading

Please encourage your child to read regularly at home.

If a child is hesitant to read, we encourage them to try a wide range of books, comics, non-fiction texts etc. until they find something that they enjoy. Reading Plus is helpful as it allows the child to choose from a wide range of texts and they are shorter than a typical children's book.



Being a confident reader will help a child across every aspect of school life.

Ed Shed

Last year, we bought into a programme called Ed Shed. The children have personal log-ins for this, which allows them access to the Spelling Shed. This is where they can practise their weekly spellings and also where they do their weekly spelling tests.



Motivation

- Reader, writer and mathematician of the week certificates
- Artist of the term certificate
- Book draw (fortnightly in KS2)
- Extra Friday break for 5 or more recorded reads (signed off by an adult)
- Head Teacher award (half termly)
- Golden tickets
- Team Points and Team Point tea parties
- Achievement points

Developing Independence

Both Year Five and Six need to be 'learning ready'. This includes:

- wearing PE kit on the appropriate days;
- bringing homework in on time and asking for their homework diary and reading record to be signed at home;
- being at school on time (8.40am), getting their equipment out and settling straight into work without being prompted.
